# Five, Five, Five or 5/5/5

Do you remember the Ice Bucket Challenge back in 2014? People would dump a bucket of ice and freezing water over their heads to raise funds and awareness to combat ALS.

Several other challenges were inspired by this: the Hipster Challenge, the Sriracha Challenge, the Crisco Challenge, Planking, the Trick Shot Challenge, the One Chip Challenge (which I've done twice and I fully regret)... and multiple others.

Challenges can be fun, rewarding and sometimes completely stupid or dangerous. Sometimes, challenges can create a movement in order to raise awareness for good causes and other times they can simply be for the purpose of online fame.

If we seek out challenges for the sake of joining a popular trend or to point the spotlight at ourselves, it is a waste of time. However, our family has discovered a challenge I'd like to invite all of you to participate in. It's called, "5/5/5." We ran across it as a challenge to parents for their kids: Give your kids 5 minutes of worship, 5 minutes of Scripture reading and 5 minutes of prayer time each day. It's only 15 minutes. How many hours do we typically burn away in front of a screen each day? Jesus instructed people to seek God's Kingdom first (Matthew 6:33). Do we shy away from that because we don't know how, or the task seems overwhelming?

5/5/5 is not just for kids. Anyone can participate. But this challenge is not about gaining fame or respect from our peers. This challenge is a part of the life of a disciple of Jesus. Paul says to pray continually (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). The psalmist writes, "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:11). The best way to learn God's word is by reading it. Psalm 71:8 speaks of continually praising God, "all day long." We can move towards these disciplines together. It doesn't have to be daunting.

In order to take part in the lifestyle God desires for His people, we have to begin somewhere. Will you take the challenge with me?

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds...but encouraging one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

# **YOUTH AUCTION**


We are going to move the Youth Auction from November to March this year.


So the plan is to have the Youth Auction in March of 2025, just like we've done in the past.

# Children's Church

What is Children's Church? Children's Church is offered year-round, during both worship services as a learning and play experience for children ages 3 years old through pre-kindergarten. Children will learn a Bible Story and Bible memory verse taught through The Gospel Project curriculum that directly ties in with the lesson they will learn that day in Preschool Sunday School!

What are the logistics? Children's Church kiddos are dismissed from "big church" during the offering time. Children, along with their adult, can exit the Sanctuary doors where they will be met by our Children's Church volunteers to get checked in. Once checked in, adults can head back to "big church" and kiddos will head down to the Preschool Wing with our Children's Church volunteers!

A note for 8:30AM Attendees: Children attending the 8:30AM service and staying for Preschool Sunday School will stay in Children's Church and transition right into Sunday School. Parents/guardians do not need to check their child out until the conclusion of Sunday School at 10:40AM.









A note for 10:45AM Attendees: Children who attended Sunday School and will then attend the 10:45AM service will still need to check out of Sunday School at 10:40AM and attend "big church" with their adult until Children's Church is dismissed.

When picking up your child from Children's Church or Preschool Sunday School, please use the main hallway to enter the Preschool Wing (on the left, just past the nursery!).

What is the mission of Words of Hope? The mission of Words of Hope is to provide people both near and far with daily access to God's Word. Words of Hope isn't just a devotional ministry, and it's not just a mission's agency either! As you connect daily to the truths of Scripture with Words of Hope, you will also grow in your appreciation of and care for the global church. Funding from Hope Church and your funds go directly to providing access to Scripture for people living around the world. Words of hope provides stores of

conversion, faith, and discipleship, encouraging your own faith walk. The Words of Hope mission will draw you near to the global church both near and far.

**How does the ministry work?** Words of Hope connects you daily to the truths of Scripture and helps you to grow in your appreciation of and care for the global church. Resources donated to Words of Hope go directly to providing access to Scripture for people living around the world. Stories of conversion, faith, and discipleship from the global church encourage your faith walk, and Christ's church is built near and far!

What does Words of Hope believe? At Words of Hope, we believe that Jesus Christ is the hope of the world. We believe that the Bible reveals God's truth. We believe that God commissions us to make disciples of all nations. We affirm the Apostles' Creed.

Where does Words of Hope work? We provide a daily English devotional in print, online, and through a smartphone app free of charge to everyone who asks. We also equip indigenous leaders to share the hope of Jesus in over 70 languages around the world. We support local leaders in unreached and under-resourced parts of the world, including Niger, Uganda, South Sudan, Turkey, Albania, Iran, India, Nepal, Bhutan, and Indonesia. In the past our funding was steered to outreach in Indonesia which is predominately Muslim.

**How is Words of Hope funded?** Words of Hope exists only through the generosity of churches and individuals committed to our mission. We receive no denominational assessments or mission shares.
